THE **BLAZE CHURCH STORY**

Pastors Keith & Amy began serving at Blaze Church in October 2015. This church building has existed in the community since the 1960s. When they arrived in 2015 there were 7 adults.

The vision was to see a life-giving, gospel-centered church thrive. Intentional environments were created where all people could come and Know God more. Weekend services began to fill up as more and more people were coming and inviting others to come too. The prayers that people had been praying for decades about this church were being answered.

The three greatest factors in shaping Blaze Church are the Holy Spirit, other pastors/leaders, and the Dream Team. We believe that without the Lord, we labor in vain. We have seen countless miracles where God has done what only He can do.



Blaze Church Small Groups Model

We base our Small Groups model on the early church as described in the Bible in the book of Acts. In Acts, you can read about how small group meetings in homes helped lay the foundation for tremendous growth in the first church in Jerusalem.

Blaze Church is a church of Small Groups, not a church with Small Groups.

Four things to know about Blaze Church Small Groups:

1. Our groups are "free market."

We want people to gather together based on things they enjoy and are important to them. Essentially, the things you are already doing in your life are the things that can make up your Small Group! From sports groups to lunch groups, parenting groups to student groups, Bible study groups to creative arts groups, our groups are as varied as we are.

2. There are three semesters every year.

BLAZE CHURCH GOVERNMENT

As you consider investing your heart, time, family, and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of Blaze's government is that you will understand that our church is structured to support the values of integritv. accountability, and spiritual authority.

Our church government is made up of three groups of elders:

1.	Guided	by	

The Pastoral Leadership Team is led by Pastor Keith. This team oversees the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. These staff pastors serve the congregation and are responsible for the development of the spiritual life of the church. The Pastoral Leadership Team serve as Staff and Non-Staff Flders.

2. Protected by _____

Our Trustees (Advisory Team) are members of the congregation appointed by the Lead Pastors and ratified by the voting membership to oversee the finances and direct the provision of the facilities needed by the church. They provide counsel to the Lead Pastor regarding the major financial commitments of the church. The Trustees serve as Non-Staff Flders.

Strengthened by ___

The Overseers are pastors of respected congregations and ministries who love Blaze Church and are willing to provide spiritual protection to the church. They may be called upon to help in accountability matters relating to the Lead Pastor if requested to do so by the Pastoral Leadership Team or Trustees. The Overseers serve as Apostolic Elders.



CHURCH FINANCES

At Blaze Church, we believe that giving is a gift from God. The reason why we give is because God first gave to us. Giving is a responsive act of worship.

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

MATTHEW 6:21

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

MATTHEW 6:24

We might have expected Jesus to say, You can't serve God and the devil. But he says the number one contender for your heart - the thing that poses a threat to **devotion** to God – is MONEY! So God gave us the greatest weapon against devotion to our money - generosity! When we give, we combat greed! Have you ever met a greedy, generous person? The two can't coexist!

We believe there are **five values for biblical giving** found in the New Testament. Giving should be:

Willing and Cheerful | 2 Corinthians 9:7 (NLT)

You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully."

2. A Regular Pattern | 1 Corinthians 16:2 (NIV)

On the **first day of every week**, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income.

3. Proportionate To One's Ability | 1 Corinthians 16:2 (NIV)

... each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income.

4. Generous | 2 Corinthians 8:3 (NIV)

For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability.

5. Sacrificial | *Mark* 12:43-44 (*NIV*)

Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.

What about tithing? The tithe, or "first fruits" of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first (Proverbs 3:9-10).

Understand that tithing existed before the law, tithing was commanded under the law, and tithing is still good for us today. While it may not be explicitly commanded in the New Testament, what we do see is that people who were changed by Jesus always gave more than the law required. We would say that because of what Jesus has done, tithing becomes the bare minimum for us today.

The best question to ask when it comes to giving is, "Because of how much God has given me, how much do I get to give back to Him?" Giving is a gift. It is a privilege. We get to give, we don't have to give.

Many people love to give to God and as they do, they want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At Blaze, we want people to understand they are giving to God through the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of Blaze, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well.

The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to Jesus and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. That is why we don't have they are worship and are not considered to be a business transaction but an expression of gratitude toward God.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Holy Bible

The Holy Bible, and only the Bible, is the authoritative Word of God. It alone is the final authority in determining all doctrinal truths. In its original writing, it is inspired, infallible, and inerrant.

Trinity

There is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These three are coequal and co-eternal.

Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ is God the Son, the second person of the Trinity. On earth, Jesus was 100% God and 100% man. He is the only man ever to have lived a sinless life. He was born of a virgin, performed miracles, died on the cross for mankind, and thus atoned for our sins through the shedding of His blood. He rose from the dead on the third day according to the Scriptures, ascended to the right hand of the Father, and will return again in power and glory.

Virgin Birth

Jesus Christ was conceived by God the Father, through the Holy Spirit (the third person of the Trinity) in the virgin Mary's womb; therefore, He is the Son of God.

Redemption

Man was created good and upright, but by voluntary transgression he fell; his only hope of redemption is in Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

For anyone to know God, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential.

Salvation

We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ: His death, burial, and resurrection. Salvation is a gift from God, not a result of our good works or of any human efforts.

Repentance

Repentance is the commitment to turn away from sin in every area of our lives and to follow Christ, which allows us to receive His redemption and to be regenerated by the Holy Spirit. Thus, through repentance we receive forgiveness of sins and appropriate salvation.

Sanctification

Sanctification is the ongoing process of yielding to God's Word and His Spirit in order to complete the development of Christ's character in us. It is through the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and the Word of God that the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life.

Jesus' Blood

The Blood that Jesus Christ shed on the Cross of Calvary was sinless and is 100% sufficient to cleanse mankind of all sin. Jesus allowed Himself to be punished for both our sinfulness and our sins, enabling all those who believe to be free from the penalty of sin, which is death.

The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

The Bible's lists of these gifts are not necessarily exhaustive, and the gifts may occur in various combinations. All believers are commanded to earnestly desire the manifestation of the gifts in their lives. These gifts always operate in harmony with the Scriptures and should never be used in violation of Biblical parameters. The Church

The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of Jesus' Great Commission. Every person who is born of the Spirit is an integral part of the Church as a member of the body of believers. There is a spiritual unity of all believers in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Sacraments

Water Baptism: Following faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, the new convert is commanded by the Word of God to be baptized in water in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Lord's Supper: A unique time of communion in the presence of God when the elements of bread and grape juice (the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ) are taken in remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross.

Marriage: We believe marriage is defined in the Bible as a covenant, a sacred bond between one man and one woman, instituted by and publicly entered into before God.

Healing of the Sick

Healing of the sick is illustrated in the life and ministry of Jesus and included in the commission of Jesus to His disciples. It is given as a sign, which is to follow believers. It is also a part of Jesus' work on the cross and one of the gifts of the Spirit.

Resurrection

ABUSE POLICY

I understand that Blaze Church is a safe place for children and vulnerable adults and that Blaze complies with all Federal and State laws regarding reporting suspected child abuse. As a member of the Dream Team. I understand that suspected abuse is to be reported to the staff member who oversees the area in which I serve. I also understand the four types of abuse defined below:

- **Physical:** a physical act directed at a child or vulnerable adult that causes iniury.
- **Sexual:** contact or interactions between a child and an adult. or another child, when the child is being used for sexual stimulation of the perpetrator or another person. This includes exploitation through photographs, videos, or other communication methods.
- **Emotional:** acts or omissions by the parent or other caregivers that have caused, or could cause, serious behavioral, cognitive, emotional, or mental disorders.
- **Neglect:** failure to provide for the child or vulnerable adult's basic needs. This includes adequate adult supervision, medical attention, housing, food, and clothing. Most cases of physical neglect involve inadequate adult supervision that has caused harm to the child or vulnerable adult or places them in danger of such harm.

I understand it is not my responsibility to investigate and in no instance will I confront a parent or caregiver if abuse is suspected. As a member of the Dream Team, I agree to comply with this policy and report any suspected abuse to the staff person who oversees the area in which I serve.

LEADERSHIP HONOR CODE

As an essential part of the Blaze Church Leadership family, you have a responsibility to develop and exhibit mature Christian behavior. This should be the basic premise of your desire to participate in a servant-leader position here at Blaze Church.

While serving the Body of Christ as a servant-leader at Blaze Church, you pledge to present a good appearance at all times. In both attire and behavior, you should strive to demonstrate Biblical standards in all situations.

As Christians, the way we present ourselves to others is of vital importance to the way others perceive Christ. Our conduct should never be an embarrassment to Christ, but should exemplify the best qualities of a mature believer and servant-leader.

Exemplifying the highest moral commitment, Blaze Church' leaders are to maintain a disciplined life of Bible reading, prayer, and fasting. You must also refrain from such things as:

- Profanity
- Indulging in much wine or other alcoholic beverages
- Dishonest gain
- Illicit druas
- Pornography
- Sexual immorality (sexual activity outside of marriage)
- All behaviors which might cause Christ to grieve and others to stumble

By providing an example in speech and action, we encourage others to grow in Christ and become servant-leaders themselves. This is a way of life measured by the heart and commitment of each leader in the Blaze Church family. We should regard it as an essential part of our development, not as an imposition or restriction.
